

Minutes of 374th Emergent Meeting (Virtual) of the NRC, NCTE held on 24th August 2022

The 374th Emergent meeting (Virtual) of Northern Regional Committee (NRC), National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) was held on 24th August, 2022 in Room No. (3rd Floor) NRC, NCTE, Plot No. G-7 Sector-10, Dwarka, New Delhi.

With permission of the Chair, Dr. Dinesh Kumar Chaturvedi, Regional Director, NRC & Convener presented the agenda before the Committee. The Item-wise decisions taken on each agenda item are as under:

The institution preferred an Appeal U/s 18 of the NCTE, Act. The Appeal Committee after considering the relevant records and documents submitted by appellant institution decided to confirm the impugned order</p>



				<p>of withdrawal dated 19/07/2021 vide its order dated 26/11/2021 with the following observation: -</p> <p>"Appeal Committee noted that appellant with its appeal memorandum has submitted copy of a letter dated 10/09/2021 conveying approval to the appointment of one principal and 15 NET qualified faculty. Appellant has further submitted a notary attested affidavit in which date of selection and appointment of faculty is shown as 10/09/2021 which is post withdrawal order dated 19/07/2021. Appellant has also submitted copy of FDRs, Form A, building Completion Certificate and a bank statement of salary disbursement of certain persons from October 2020 to March 2021. Bank statement submitted by the appellant has no relevant as the list of faculty is seen approved and appointed on 10/09/2021. Appellant has failed to submit evidence to prove that it had requisite number of faculty approved and appointed during the preceding years of withdrawal".</p> <p>Aggrieved with the withdrawal order dated 19/07/2021 as well as the appellate authority order dated 26/11/2021, the institution filed WP (C) 14682/2021 & CM APPL 46222/2021 in the High Court of Delhi and the Hon'ble High Court passed order dated 20/12/202, giving the following directions</p> <p>"For the aforesaid reasons, the impugned orders dated 19/07/2021 and 26/11/2021 are set aside and the matter is remanded to the NRC for a fresh decision in accordance with law keeping in mind the documents placed on record by the petitioner before the Appellate Committee. As the order of withdrawal is set aside by the virtue of this order, it goes without saying that the petitioner will be treated as a recognized institution for all purposes and will participate in counselling and</p>

				<p>admit students for the academic year 2021-2022 and for all subsequent years, until and unless a fresh order of withdrawal is passed against it. The NRC is directed to issue an order of restoration of recognition of the petitioner within two weeks from today. The status of the petitioner as a recognized institution will also be reflected on the NCTE's website, and will be communicated by NCTE to the University as well as to the concerned State Government. The respondents are directed to comply with these directions within the same time period.</p> <p>" Pursuance to the above Court order, the matter was considered in NRC in its 360 (part-2) meeting held on 29 December 2021 and committee decided that (1) institution is permitted to participate in the counselling process for admitting student for current session 2021-2022 and for all subsequent years until and unless a fresh order of withdrawal is passed against it (for 100 students (two units of 50 student each) (2) the withdrawal order will be effective from the end of the academic session 2021-22.</p> <p>The matter was again considered in NRC in its 361st (Virtual) meeting held on 13th & 14th January 2022 and decided that as the withdrawal order has been set aside the NRC is directed to issue a fresh order of restoration of recognition to the petitioner within two weeks and also to update the petitioners status as a recognized institution on its portal. In view of the above, the committee decided restoration of recognition order to the institution be issued and the status of the institution be updated as a recognized institution on the website of the NRC. Accordingly, corrigendum order was issued to the institution on 02/02/2022.</p> <p>The institution has filed WP (C)11160/2022 in the High Court of</p>


