Commencement of the Academic Session of the Programme / Courses as Mentioned in the Order of Recognition Granted by NRC, NCTE.

It has come to the notice of NRC that the affiliating bodies are granting affiliation to Teacher Education Institutions for start of specific Teacher Education Course for the academic session 2022-2023 on the basis of recognition order issued by NRC for the academic session 2020-2021 or before. Accordingly, the matter was considered by NRC in its 371st meeting held on 11th-12th July 2022 and decision is as under: -

"The matter was carefully considered by NRC in the light of NCTE Act, 1993, Rules, Regulations and Guidelines issued by NCTE from time to time and the Committee took the following decision for the adherence/commencement of the beginning of the session strictly as per the session mentioned in the order of Recognition to the TEIs.

An advisory be issued to the TEIs/Universities/ Affiliating Institutions/examination Bodies/Centre & State Authorities for the strict compliance of the commencement of the session for the Recognized courses as mentioned in the order. Further in no circumstances, affiliation be granted or considered for the commencement of the course of academic session prior or after of the session mentioned in the order."

Accordingly, as per the decision of NRC in 371st meeting held on 11th-12th July 2022, all the TEIs/Universities/ Affiliating Institutions/Examination Bodies/Centre & State Authorities / Government, as the case may be are requested for strict compliance of the commencement of the session for the Recognized Courses as mentioned in the order.

Under no circumstances, the affiliation be granted or considered for the commencement of the course of academic session prior or after the session as mentioned in the order of recognition granted by NRC, NCTE.
